7th Bishop of BCA - Bishop Ryotai Matsukage

Rev. Sensho Inouye

Bishop Ryotai Matsukage was the first Bishop of BCA who died in the United States during his tenure of office. The 6 Bishops before him had returned to Japan and died there. **Bishop Matsukage** lost his wife during the war at the Topaz Relocation Center. After the loss of his wife, he was a lonely man. Yet in his loneliness with faith and courage, like many other missionaries, he had dedicated his whole life and energy to the propagation of the teaching of Nembutsu in the United States. Although weak in health, he supervised the organization through one of its most difficult periods.

Bishop Matsukage died at the Japanese Hospital in Los Angeles on June 21, 1948, at the age of fifty-eight. On June 28 and 29 in San Francisco, Wake and Funeral Services were held and his ashes were interred at the Colma Cemetery five miles south of San Francisco,

At the 1949 Lay Representatives Meeting in San Francisco, the delegates approved the erection of a monument for the late **Bishop Matsukage**.

With the help of the members of the Placer Buddhist Church and with Muneichi Yamasaki as chairman, a ten-foot long rock was located in the hills of Placer County in Northern California. Hauling the rock was not an easy task, for in the process two trucks broke down.

On February 18, 1951, during the BCA National Council Meeting in San Francisco, the monument was dedicated. On a base four feet in height, the huge ten-foot natural rock stands in majestic awe with the inscription "*Namu Amida Butsu*". The original writing was done by the former **Lord Abbot Kosho Ohtani**.

Bishop Matsukage's last message goes as follows:

"Waga hone wo America no chi ni uzumete zo, Toa ni minori no iyasaki wo nen zu."

"Bury my ashes in the soil of America, and into eternity may the Dharma prosper."
